

Expansion: Serving More Families through More Housing

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Dear Board of Directors,

Our organization creates space to empower women to do hard things. Change is not easy and for lasting change to take place, time and support are necessary. We have been doing and will continue to be a place to help lighten the weight for women who are committed to doing hard things to make their lives and futures better. Our mission is to provide long-term residential housing and comprehensive support services to pregnant women experiencing homelessness. The goal is to help women regain their independence and dignity. Through our housing-first approach, we are not only addressing immediate needs but also creating a profound generational impact that reverberates across families and communities.

In 2023, we housed 16 women and provided a safe home for their 32 children. This year alone, through our various programs, we have supported 292 women and 216 children, ensuring that families are equipped with the resources and tools they need to break the cycles of poverty and homelessness.

At Virginia Women and Family Support Center, our housing program gives women the wrap-around supportive services they need to reclaim their independence. These services include but are not limited to, trauma and wellness counseling, education continuation, job training, maternal health support, parenting classes, financial management coaching, and volunteerism. Our vision is for every pregnant woman to have access to stable housing, quality healthcare, and safety, where their children can grow and develop the confidence they need to excel. We have been at the forefront of the housing, maternal, and mental health crisis. We are helping women advocate for themselves in the workplace, educational settings, and during the maternal to include labor and delivery, and post-partum periods through our education and awareness-building programs.

Our long-term housing program, which spans up to 24 months, provides the critical time and resources needed for residents to heal, gain independence, and secure stable futures for themselves and their children. These women now have the tools to raise confident, healthy children, ensuring that the effects of this support extend far beyond the immediate family.

Virginia Women and Family Support Center is a 501(c)3 nonprofit dedicated to housing women who are pregnant and homeless and their families. Founded in 2016, we invest in housing vulnerable pregnant women and their children through our long-term residential program. During the 24-months our resident mothers are in our program, we offer foundational courses and support to address the root cause of instability, VAWFSC helps residents regain independence, dignity, and hope for a better, brighter future for themselves and their children. Through our housing-first model, residents create plans and goals through one-on-one sessions with case managers, attend to their trauma, workforce preparation for the marketplace, parenting education, maternal and mental health services, and trauma recovery programs.

Our Mission

Our mission is to provide long-term residential housing to pregnant women who are experiencing homelessness, and to empower them with the resources and support they need to create a stable foundation for themselves and their families.



Leadership

Our leaders make the vision of the VAWFSC a reality. We work to create a world where every pregnant woman has access to safe and stable housing, and where every child has the opportunity to grow up in a healthy and supportive environment.



Service Areas

Our mission goes beyond providing housing - we offer a lifeline of hope and a path to a brighter future for pregnant women and their children facing homelessness. Our holistic approach addresses the whole person.

Housing: Safe, stable accommodations for up to 24 months in phase 1 of our program

Maternal Health: Comprehensive prenatal and postpartum care

Mental Health: Individual counseling and group therapy

Trauma Recovery: Evidence-based, trauma-informed interventions

Education & Career Development: GED preparation, vocational training, and job placement assistance

Through these integrated services, we empower women to overcome challenges, build resilience, and achieve long-term independence. Each day, we witness remarkable transformations as families break free from homelessness and create futures filled with promise.





The Problem: Pregnant and Homeless

According to the 2020 Annual Homeless Assessment Report, there was an increase of 14,787 unsheltered homeless individuals and a 13% increase in unsheltered families. The report shows that **39% were women**, totaling **223,578.**

Homeless young women are almost **five times** more likely to become pregnant and far more likely to experience multiple pregnancies than housed young women. Homeless women **14 to 25** years of age who became pregnant were more likely to have experienced intrafamilial incest, sexual abuse at an early age, and **more** severe sexual abuse than young, homeless women who do not become pregnant.



Virginia Women and Family Support Center commitment extends beyond housing. Recognizing the hardships and traumas faced by residents, our organization places a strong emphasis on trauma care. A dedicated team of compassionate professionals provides specialized counseling, therapy sessions, and tailored support to address emotional wounds and past adversities. By focusing on trauma care, Virginia Women and Family Support Center empowers residents to cope with past experiences, fostering resilience and a renewed sense of self-worth. Healing the whole person is essential for creating a positive ripple effect, extending far beyond their stay.



Beyond The Numbers



178 Calls For Help

The 178 calls received in 2023 serve as a poignant reminder of the pressing issue of homelessness and the vital role Virginia Women and Family Support Center plays in addressing it. Each call represents a unique story, an individual or family seeking stability and a safe place to call home. Behind these numbers are individuals who have faced adversity, experienced displacement, and longed for a glimmer of hope. VAWFSC's dedicated team works tirelessly to assess each situation, offering solutions to create positive change.

The Solution

Our Unique, Housing-First Approach



At the Virginia Women and Family Support Center, we firmly believe in the power of a housingfirst approach to support homeless pregnant women and mothers. We recognize that secure shelter forms the foundation upon which all other aspects of stability and personal growth are built. For the mothers we serve, safe and stable housing is crucial. It provides a secure environment for both mother and child, creates a stable setting for prenatal care and child development, and establishes a fixed address necessary for accessing services, employment, and education. We've seen how this stability significantly reduces stress, allowing mothers to focus on personal growth and family needs while restoring a sense of dignity and normalcy.



By addressing the fundamental need for housing first, we create a solid platform from which mothers can tackle other challenges. We are committed to this housing-first model because we understand that for homeless mothers, a safe and stable home isn't just a basic need—it's the critical first step on the path to self-sufficiency and a brighter future for both mother and child. At Virginia Women and Family Support Center, we're not just providing housing; we're building the groundwork for transformed lives and stronger families and future generations.



The Solution -Expansion: More Housing



In 2016, the Virginia Women and Family Support Center, originally founded as Carried To Full Term, embarked on a mission to end homelessness among pregnant women and their children. In 2024, we've experienced significant growth, acquiring two additional properties—a house in Manassas and an office in Gainesville. This expansion is a testament to our commitment to making our biggest dreams a reality, enabling us to assist hundreds of families and profoundly impact their futures.

Impact Report

Virginia Women and Family Support Center supported 78 mothers and their children in 2023. We are proud to share the measurable outcomes of our efforts, showcasing the transformative impact on the lives we touch.

Our education initiatives saw 22 women pursue further education or vocational training, unlocking new avenues for personal and professional growth. In terms of financial management, participants demonstrated significant empowerment, witnessing an impressive average 65% increase in savings. Moreover, 32 women successfully secured sustainable income sources, fostering economic independence.

Prioritizing mental well-being, 65 women received trauma counseling, leading to an average 50% reduction in trauma-related symptoms based on pre- and postassessment scores. Our focus on workforce development yielded remarkable results, with 85% of women improving their job-related skills through education and workforce development classes, paving the way for increased employability and career advancement.

These outcomes underscore the effectiveness of our comprehensive approach in empowering women to overcome challenges and build promising futures. 65%

Fund Development for Sustainability: Increase annual revenue from private donors through our monthly membership program. Increase revenue also by diversifying funding

sources from but not limited to state and government funds, public funders, foundations, and grants.

Board Development: Become an organization with a Board that is strategic, effective, and self-sustaining.

Systems Improvement for Efficiency, Effectiveness, and Empowerment of Staff: To

develop processes to ensure an effective internal system with decision-making processes, staff evaluations, data management, staff training, and program evaluation.
